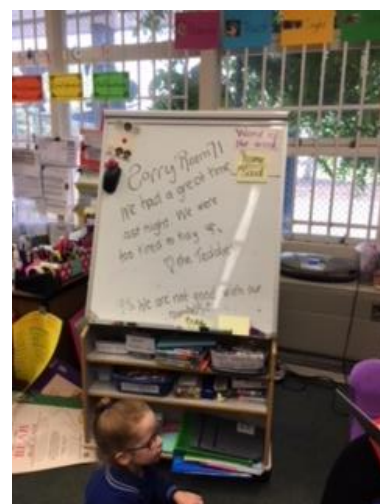

Imogen replied, 'Frida Kahlo.'

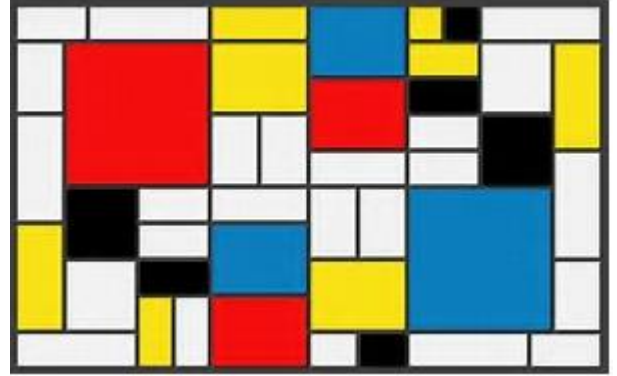
Leo stated, 'I like her but I think Mondrian is better.'

Out from left field someone said, 'I like van Gogh.'

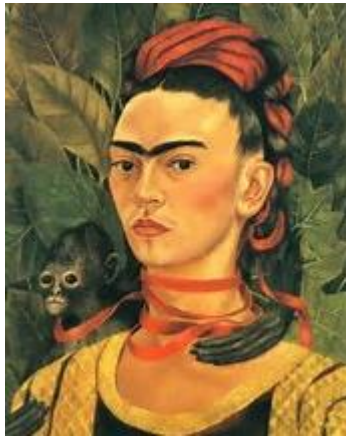
'Who's van Gogh?' they asked.

A Day on Mars

On Wednesday the 10th of October Unit 4 visited Strathmore Space Station. When we got there, we met three of our space instructors for the day. There were various activities planned.

The first activity we did was a thing involving Spheros. We connected the Spheros to iPads and took the main control to code them. Our aim was to go in squares to hit the flags. There were 4 different types of flags. The easiest was the blue flag; the second easiest was the green; the second hardest was the yellow; the hardest was the orange. Orange was the hardest because there was only one, and it was on a hill. Blue was the easiest because they were closer together. And you get what the green flag (it was farther away) and the yellow (which was really far, well kind of) were. There was only one orange flag, but like I said, it was on a hill. Then, we went outside for snack.



At the end of snack we put on our space suits and after having our stylish space pictures taken as a group, we headed off into two separate groups. Our group went to the space station where we turned into ground controllers. We were now in control of the astronauts (group 2) that were sent to Mars.

We had access to Mars and were able to message our astronauts, making sure that they were safe and they had all the materials they needed. We also had a full view of how our astronauts were doing. We had a list of questions to ask them as well. We had a control panel, we had to run checks to make sure that Mars was safe for our astronauts. If something was unsafe we would have to quickly react by answering a question.

Everything was going smoothly until towards the end a big alarm went off in our control room telling us that the astronauts had to evacuate quickly. We had to communicate as best as we could or the astronauts would die. Luckily group one got group two out safely thanks to their teamwork and communication efforts.

The group that got sent to Mars got to perform experiments to explore the new environment. We were split into several groups, some groups were testing dirt on Mars, others focused on how electric wiring works and what happens when two different wires are touched together. Another included a robotic arm that a group got to play around with as well as experimenting with acids and bases. It was a great hands on day that all students enjoyed.



Congratulations Lara!

On Tuesday last week our grade 5 ***cross country/ 1800 /200 and 800 School and District champion***, Lara, ran in the regional championships for both the 1500mt and the 800mt distance. She previously won both of these events at the District and Division level making her eligible to compete at the regional level

All of us here at AVW are thrilled to say that Lara came second in the 800mt and now will progress to the Track and Field State Championships to be held on Mon 30 Oct at Lakeside Stadium Athletics Track.

Although previously qualifying last year as a 10 year old for State Finals, she was unable to make it due to ill health.

Lara's dedication and ability to running saw her join her local Little Athletics Club a few years ago, which surly must have an impact to her great results.

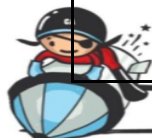
